DIRECTOR OF STUDIES



AoG Incorporated (AoG) is a nationally recognised Pentecostal movement that has been serving the people of Great Britain since 1924. At the core of the AoG is a passionate desire to see God's Kingdom grow through the local church.

We are looking for a Director of Studies to lead Mattersey Hall, the AoG Bible College, at what is a very exciting time for the College and for the movement.

We have already begun to make significant changes to curriculum and how we deliver courses. In the last six months alone, we have created and had approved by Chester University a brand new BA in Theology and Christian Leadership. We've also moved from a residential teaching programme to a blended delivery programme which includes classroom, placement and digital learning environments and which enables many more people to access Higher Education that is specifically tailored to a Pentecostal context.

This is a varied part-time role, involving day-to-day leadership of the College as well as working with AoG senior management to develop the future strategy and offering of the College. The successful candidate will be responsible for promoting and marketing the College and proactively recruiting students, both of which will involve nationwide travel. The Director of Studies will ensure high academic and leadership standards are maintained in the College and will be fully involved in teaching our programmes as well as ensuring the care of our students is a key priority, encouraging them to fulfil their potential. Previous experience in Teaching and Senior Leadership roles is essential, as is a Masters in Theology or Leadership.

The role is currently based in Mattersey (Doncaster), however the site is in the process of being sold and the AoG Leadership Team are looking for the right site for the College, with the aim of it being based in a more urban environment.

Due to the nature of this role and the level of regular interaction with Christian leaders and students on behalf of AoG and the College, we believe that this post is subject to an occupational requirement that the holder be a practicing Christian under Part 1 of schedule 9 to the Equality Act 2010.
